

## HIV AND AIDS STIGMA INDEX TOOL

Stigma associated with HIV and AIDS is a major barrier to effectively responding to the pandemic. Stigma stops individuals from getting tested and treated, and it causes needless suffering when people are either known or thought to be HIV positive. Stigma makes the pandemic worse because the disease spreads faster when people don't get tested and when treatment is delayed.
